In 2010 when I ran for office, I promised these four things:

- Reduce NH State spending

If you review the bills that I worked on and the legislation that was passed you will see that I kept my promises.

This year we need to tackle the NH "income" tax, otherwise known as the BET. This is a tax that hurts all NH businesses needs to be reduced or repealed.

Today, I am one of the Mechanical engineering leads at Segway working to bring the company to a prosperous future.

In addition to being a full time engineer, I have been on the board of directors for a condo association, and I am currently on the board of directors for a gun rights group.
